

Oliverios celebrate 50th anniversary

HARDYSTON — May 20 marked the 50th wedding anniversary of Millie and Win Oliverio of Hardyston.

The couple were married in Dalhart, Tex., in 1943 when Oliverio was a captain in the U.S. Air Corps and pilot of the B-17 Flying Fortress and his bride was an Air Corps lieutenant and nurse.

After a four-day honeymoon, the groom flew his crew to England where he served with the 8th Air Corps during World War II.
