## PART I - NARRATIVE

Colonel Robert D. Williams was born September 22, 1919, in Lexington, Massachusetts, but calls McQueeney, Texas his home. He graduated from John Marshall High School of Richmond, Virginia in 1936. He has studied at three different colleges; University of Richmond, University of North Carolina and the University of Alabama.

Upon completion of pilot training, Colonel Williams was commissioned a second lieutenant, March 12, 1944. He then completed transition training in the B-17 and was sent to England where he flew 30 combat missions. His combat experience extended to the Korean conflict where as Executive Officer of the 80th Fighter Squadron, 8th Fighter Wing, he flew 107 missions in F-80s. In the Vietnam conflict he flew 45 missions in the A-37 and F-5 fighter aircraft.

During his career, all of his assignments have been directly connected with operations with the exception of

duties with the Director of Personnel at Headquarters, Air Training Command, Randolph AFB, Texas from August 1961 until November 1963.

Colonel Williams' former duties include an assignment as an operations staff officer with the Military Assistance Advisory Group, Madrid, Spain, from August 1959 until September 1962. Also noteworthy during his colorful career is the fact that he led a jet acrobatic team at Moody AFB, Georgia, from 1952 to 1953 and as commander of the USAF Instrument Pilot Instructor School he organized the second World-Wide USAF Instrument Flying Symposium at Randolph AFB, Texas in 1965.

In June 1966, Colonel Williams became the Assistant Deputy Commander for Operations of 363rd Tactical Reconnaissance Wing, Shaw AFB, South Carolina. On April 1, 1967, he was named Deputy Commander for Operations and held that position until January 17, 1968, when he became Vice Commander of the wing flying RF-4C and RF-101 aircraft. In June 1968, he was assigned as Wing Vice Commander of the 26th Tactical Reconnaissance Wing, Ramstein AB, Germany where he was combat ready in the F-4E and RF-4C. From Germany he proceeded to Vietnam in August 1970 to become Deputy Chief, Air Force Advisory Group, Republic of Vietnam, flying F-5 and A-37 combat missions. Upon completion of this combat tour in August 1971 he was assigned to

Headquarters Pacific Air Forces, Hickam AFB, Hawaii and currently occupies the position of Director of Operations, Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations.

A command pilot, his decorations include the Legion of Merit (1 OLC), the Distinguished Flying Cross (1 OLC), Air Medal (8 OLC), the Bronze Star and two Air Force Commendation Medals. Foreign decorations include the Vietnam Gallantry Cross, RVN National Order of Vietnam, and Staff Service Honor Medal.

Colonel Williams is married to the former Gloria Shiner of Bandera, Texas.
